

New digital signs at the Grenfell Tower site

We are installing three digital signs around the fencing at the Grenfell Tower. This will improve how we communicate with the community around the site, including about any works that take place.

What will the digital signs display?

Currently we are planning to use the digital signs to show information about:

- Site activities, such as replacing the wrapping around the tower, illuminations on important dates and garage access
- Health and safety messages
- Events in the community
- Contact details for the Site Management Team
- Other ways to receive information about work at the site
- How to get in touch

We would like you to tell us what you'd like to see on the digital signs – what kind of information would you find useful? We'll be regularly asking for this feedback on the signs themselves.

Where will the digital signs be placed?

The signs will be placed at:

- Grenfell Road site entrance
- Station Approach site entrance
- Grenfell Walk

What's the plan for introducing the digital signs?

Between now and Wednesday 12 February, you can visit Baseline Studios (Whitchurch Road, London, W11 4AT) to see one of the digital signs and get an idea of what they will look like.

The signs will then be installed on Thursday 13 February and live content will be included shortly after that date.

Who will manage the signs?

The signs are being managed by the Ministry of Housing, Communities and Local Government (MHCLG), which manages the Grenfell Tower site.

MHCLG will publish content onto the signs.

What do the signs look like?

The screen on the digital signs is 49 inches high and will either be incorporated into the site fencing or will be free-standing. On the right is an example of a free-standing sign from another site:
